MEETING MINUTES

ROLL CALL & QUORUM: Roll was called (see Attachment A), which resulted in 19 eligible representatives. This equates to 74% of the current participation percentage being in attendance, which is greater than the 50% needed to have a quorum of the Reservoir Committee. By approximately 9:45 AM, participation had increased to 20 members, which resulted in a 76% participation percentage of voting members.

CALL TO ORDER:

Chairman Bettner called the meeting to order at 9:32 AM followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

AGENDA APPROVAL:

It was moved by Cheng and seconded by Kunde to approve the January 19, 2018 Sites Reservoir Committee Agenda. Motion approved unanimously.

MEETING MINUTES APPROVAL:

Approval of December 21, 2017 meeting minutes was moved by Azevedo and seconded by Brittian with no change. Motion approved unanimously.

1.2 Presentation by Jeffery Mount

> Dr. Jeff Mount gave a presentation on managing California's freshwater ecosystems in light of the drought that ended in 2016.

> The presentation proposed to establish ecosystem water budgets, and using the system's flexibility to meet ecosystem objectives.

1.3 February 2018 Reservoir Committee Elections (Attachment 1-3)

Elections are proposed for the next meeting on February 15, 2018. Committee members were encouraged to volunteer for work groups they are interested in.

The current list of work group and assignments includes the addition of the Risk Assessment Work Group that was created in the December 21, 2017 meeting. It is expected that with the election of officers for next month, the structure of the work groups will also be revisited and potentially modified for the remainder of Phase 1.

2. Manager's Report:

2.1 Informational discussion of project status for the month of December 2017.

> General Manager Watson provided a recap of the joint workshop with the Sites Joint Powers Authority (JPA) to develop a procurement strategy that will be used to develop a procurement plan. This informational and public workshop was held on January 18, 2018. Further discussion was held under agenda item 7.

Staff is also in the process of retaining a financial advisor for the project.

Staff continues to work on cost controls and a Phase 1 completion schedule.

2.2 Report out on the California Water Commission Meeting on January 18, 2018.

> At the California Water Commission (CWC) Meeting on January 18, 2018, the staff announced their decisions on the preliminary benefit-cost ratios. After completing preliminary reviews, none of the eleven eligible projects had a ratio greater than one. Five of the eleven projects received a ratio of zero, two projects were within 0 to 0.5, and four projects were within 0.5 to 0.9.

Staff met with the CWC technical reviewers on January 11, 2018 to better understand their scoring process. Staff plans to use the appeal process to provide supplemental information requested by the technical reviewers.

The Water Commission staff reported that the Sites Project has eligible benefits in water for refuges, recreation, and flood, but the CWC requires further clarification for the salmon and delta smelt benefits. To model salmon benefits on the Feather River, a temperature model is needed, however CWC was not able to provide further direction.

On February 2, 2018, formal comments will be released from the CWC. Applicants will then have until February 23, 2018 to submit their appeal. On April 23, 2018 the CWC staff will conduct their review, and then turn over to the CWC Process of finalizing the benefit-cost ratio from May 1 – May 3, 2018. On May 25, 2018, CWC is expected to release initial return-on-investment scores, which will be finalized through the end of June. Dollar values will be assigned to individual projects by the end of July.

General Manager Watson asked the Reservoir Committee if it desired to convene the work group that reviewed to original WSIP Application to review the appeal before its submission on February 23, 2018, one week after the next Reservoir Committee meeting. No action was taken.

In response to a question related to funding the appeal, General Manager Watson stated that due to the complexity of our proposal, we had planned to use the appeal process to clarify aspects such as how O&M costs would be addressed and there will not be a cash call to support this appeal process; the contingencies built into Phase 1 will cover costs.

3. Ad Hoc Finance & Economics Work Group:

3.1Review Payment of Claims and Treasurer's Report

Treasurer Traynham provided an overview of the Treasurer's Report for December 31, 2017. Vanderwaal motioned to approve the Treasurer's Report, which was seconded by Hartwig.

Staff is still working to schedule a meeting with Yolo County to address their outstanding invoice.

3.2 Discussion and possible direction to staff regarding the retention of an Independent Municipal Financial Advisor.

Joe Trapasso provided update on the status of the solicitation process. Staff has completed a draft Request-for-Proposals (RFP) to address the scope of work of the position. Legal Counsel has approved the RFP with comments, and the finalized RFP is scheduled to go out by January 26, 2018. The RFP process will follow a standard 30 day schedule.

4. Ad Hoc Document Review Work Group:

4.1 Discussion and possible direction to staff regarding comments received to the Draft EIR/EIS.

The public comment period on the Draft EIR/EIS has closed as of Monday January 15, 2018. The report handed out in the meeting delineates the individuals and organizations who submitted comments.

5. Ad Hoc Members' Reservoir Ops WG:

Kunde & Ruiz

Report out on progress to:

- Update the analysis of operations for south of Delta participation.
- Consider using storage as a potential method to finance project construction costs and annual operations and maintenance costs.
- Develop a draft risk matrix for use in the Phase 1 rebalancing process.

The Operations Work Group has been focused on the rebalancing process and has completed the first iteration of a draft matrix of costs and benefits of the project presented in dollars per acre-foot. The group anticipates two more iterations will be needed. The goal is to get the matrix into a form where all participants can use it as the basis to decide their agency's respective participation in the project's Phase 2.

In addition, the Operations Work Group is evaluating the potential to base repayment on storage as opposed to deliveries. A benchmarking exercise has identified the use of storage as a repayment method is being used in a couple of locations, primarily in Idaho.

6. <u>Ad Hoc Siting Work Group</u>:

6.1 Discussion and possible direction to staff regarding the development of draft procedures to support temporary rights of entry.

For the start of Phase 2, the need to conduct geotechnical exploration (and other studies) will require access to private property. Processes and procedures need to be developed to enable the Authority to obtain temporary rights of entry to allow this data to be collected and studies performed.

Kevin Spesert is analyzing various alternatives and processes including Caltrans process.

7. <u>Ad Hoc Water Facilities Work Group</u>: Watson for Arita

- 7.1 Discussion and possible direction to staff regarding:
 - Results from using the Construction Industry Institute's Project Development and Construction Strategy (PDCS) process (refer to December 21, 2017 meeting). (Attachment 7-1)
 - Next steps to finalize the procurement strategy and develop the plan.

Staff has used the values provided at the December 21, 2017 Reservoir Committee meeting to develop a proposed procurement strategy - primarily focused on design and construction services (page 4 of the attachment). The proposed strategy was the topic of the January 18, 2018 workshop.

NOTE: The PowerPoint and discussion notes from the workshop are posted on the website.

Based on feedback received, staff will advance the strategy and begin to develop a procurement plan. To have consultant resources ready to begin work at the start of Phase 2, staff proposes to release a Request-for-Qualifications (RFO) by April 2018. This one solicitation is intended to result in multiple contracts for the different services needed and allow the industry to propose alternative concepts.

Ad Hoc Risk Management Work Group: 8.

 Report out on discussions to perform an initial risk assessment.

A two-day meeting is planned for February 6-7, 2018 to develop a risk register that will be used to develop a target guaranteed maximum price to be used in rebalancing process and as an aid in future decision-making.
