MINUTES

1:00 PM - CALL TO ORDER:

Chairman Headrick called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m., followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

ROLL CALL:

Roll was called (See Attachment A), which resulted in 15 eligible representatives. This equated to 76.8% of the current participation percentage being in attendance, which is greater than the 50% needed to have a quorum of the Reservoir Committee. By 2 p.m., 2 additional members were seated bringing the total participation percentage to 86%. At 2:45 p.m., 15 members were seated bringing the total participation percentage to 77.1%.

He stated the major reason they are interested in Sites is they don't have enough water to meet demands; it's either "feast or famine".

3.1 Discussion and possible direction to staff regarding the Sites Project's monthly status report. (Attachment 3-1A)

General Manager Watson provided an overview of project activities performed in the months of October and November 2019 as follows:

Continued discussions with the CDFW

- Continued support of Reclamation on their feasibility report and continue to advance the affordability analysis.
- November 13, 2019, participated in a meeting with River Garden Farms which included members from the Environmental community to advance Public Policy Institute of California's (PPIC) concept of freshwater ecosystem water budgets.
- November 15, 2019, Joint Authority/Reservoir Committee Workshop regarding the Value Planning Exercise.
- November 20, 2019, Congressman Garamendi met with Reclamation Commissioner Burman to discuss the importance of the Sites Project.
- November 20, 2019, Secretary Crowfoot attended the Gray Lodge Water Supply Project Opening Ceremony and in his opening remarks mentioned the need for the Sites Reservoir.
- 3.2 Discussion and possible direction to staff regarding Proposition 1, WSIP activities and WIIN Act Funding.

General Manager Watson provided a review of Proposition 1, WSIP activities and WIIN Act Funding as follows:

- Water Commission met on November 20, 2019 and considered the following matters:
 - o Commissioner Byrne's resignation after 12 years.
 - o Commissioner Herrera was acknowledged and received an award from Rachel's Network for contributions to disadvantaged communities.
 - o Commission reviewed their draft Strategic Plan and will consider adoption of the Plan at their December 2019 meeting.
 - o Dwayne Chisum, Antelope Valley-East Kern Water Agency, presented their case for consistency determination with the WIIN Act to allow the South-North Intertie Pipeline to be consider eligible for WIIN Act funding and the Commission approved their request.

- o DWR staff briefed Commission on its new Division of Multi-Benefit Initiatives.
- o Update on construction activities for the State Water Project.
- o Presentation on the status of SGMA implementation.
- o Early Funding Agreement invoices submitted, with a 3rd invoice to be submitted in early December 2019.
- o Submitted 5th Quarterly Report and a summarized comparison of the quarterly report for all eight eligible projects.
- o Prepared an analysis of the state investments under Proposition 1 Ecosystem Water Budget.
- USDA:
 - o Will be preparing an end of year status report in early 2020 to advance the Sites Reservoir project (Intertie).
- WIIN Act:
 - o Nothing to report.
- Reclamation Funding-related Agreements:
 - Amendment to the 2015 cost-share MOU and are waiting for Reclamation to countersign the Agreement.
 - o Financial Assistance Agreement.

Ms. Forsythe provided an update regarding progress with the California Department of Fish and Wildlife. She stated the last 2 meetings focused on how best to represent potential operational parameters in the Calsim modeling. Discussion followed regarding the Calsim modeling and narrowing the uncertainties, the need for additional modeling, Water fix criteria and NDOI concerns.

7.1 Discussion and possible direction to staff regarding the ongoing activities of the Reservoir Operations Work Group.

Mr. Kunde provided an update regarding the ongoing activities of the Reservoir Operations Work Group. He stated a Conference call was held on November 6, 2019 regarding a status briefing from Mr. Tull on the various matters Jacobs is working on in respect to:

- Modeling.
- Assumptions used in developing the latest affordability analysis in respect to modeling and yields.
- Doing additional modeling related to Fremont Weir and potential impact on Sites.
- Significant differences between Calsim and Daily model in respect to Fremont Weir.
- Importance of exchanges in Shasta with respect to implementing value planning alternatives.
- Preliminary discussion with Bureau staff with respect on how to implement these operational exchanges and they are willing to consider an agreement to implement these.
- Water quality modeling in Shasta and Sites-temperature (Alternative D).
- Ms. Forsythe and Mr. Tull have drafted an operational memorandum.
- Mr. Tull has drafted a survey with data in order to refine the demand pattern for various participants.
- Next meeting of the Ad Hoc Reservoir Operations Work Group will be focused on the annotated outline being worked on by Ms. Forsythe.
