CALL TO ORDER/PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:

Authority Board Vice Chair called the Joint Authority Board (AB) and Reservoir Committee (RC) Meeting to order at the hour of 9:00 a.m., followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

ROLL CALL/ATTENDANCE:

Roll of the Authority Board members was called (Attachment B) and there was a quorum present.

Roll of the Reservoir Committee was called (Attachment A), which resulted in 20 eligible representatives. This equated to 88.87% of the current participation percentage being in attendance, which is greater than the 50% needed to have a quorum of the Reservoir Committee.

 - Letter from CDFW in April requesting additional information.

- Staff transmitted information for three of five requests in August; expects to transmit information on the remaining two requests by the end of the month.
- Expect construction ITP issued shortly after Authority completes the California Environmental Quality Act process.
