MINUTES

CALL TO ORDER/PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:

Authority Board Chairman Durst called the Joint Authority Board (AB) and Reservoir Committee (RC) Meeting to order at the hour of 9:00 a.m., followed by Roll Call and the Pledge of Allegiance.

ROLL CALL/ATTENDANCE:

Roll of the Authority Board equaled 8 members in attendance, which resulted in a quorum.

Roll call of the Reservoir Committee equaled 19 representatives, 89.91% in attendance, which resulted in a quorum.

INTRODUCTIONS:

The Sites Staff, Consultants, and members of the public introduced themselves.

AGENDA APPROVAL:

It was moved by Director Allen, seconded by Director Dennis to approve the December 16, 2022 Joint Reservoir Committee and Authority Board Meeting Agenda. **Motion carried: All Directors present voted yes.**

ANNOUNCEMENT OF CLOSED SESSION:

Counsel Doud announced the Authority Board of Directors, and the Reservoir Committee members would consider Closed Session matters 5.1-5.5.

PERIOD FOR PUBLIC COMMENT:

Authority Board Chairman Durst called for a period of public comment. Hearing none, he closed the period for public comment.

1. CONSENT AGENDA:

Reservoir Committee Chair Bettner and Authority Board Chair Durst made time to consider consent agenda items 1.1 through 1.4 as follows:

- 1.1 Consider approval of November 18, 2022, Reservoir Committee Meeting Minutes.
- 1.2 Consider approval of November 21, 2022, Authority Board Meeting Minutes.
- 1.3 Consider acceptance of the Sites Project Authority Treasurer's Report.
- 1.4 Consider approval of the Payment of Claims.

ACTION RESERVOIR COMMITTEE:

It was moved by Pryor, seconded by Vanderwaal to approve Consent Agenda Item Numbers 1.1 and 1.3 through 1.4. **Motion carried unanimously.**

ACTION AUTHORITY BOARD:

It was moved by Director Murphy, seconded by Director Arnold to approve Consent Agenda Item Numbers 1.2 through 1.4. **Motion carried**: **All Directors present voted yes.**

2. ACTION ITEMS:

2.1 Approve the following actions for the 2023 – 2024 Proposed Sites Reservoir Test Pits, Fault Studies and Quarry Studies (Project): (1) adoption of the CEQA Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration; (2) adoption of the Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program; (3) approval of the Project; and (4) authorize the Executive Director to file all related notices and pay all related fees.

Ms. Forsythe presented on 2023-2024 Proposed Sites Reservoir Test Pits, Fault Studies and Quarry Studies and spoke to the following:

- Test Pits provide information regarding the quantity and quality of borrow materials at proposed quarry locations and pipeline trench stability.
- Fault Studies provide information regarding the location and stratigraphy of suspected and known fault traces/zones and to further evaluate the areas for evidence of the last movement.
- Quarry Studies provide information regarding the quantity and quality of borrow materials proposed for dam and reservoir feature construction fill and assess the means and methods needed to remove overburden and rock materials during construction.
- Change made to Mitigation Measure Bio-6; Giant Garter Snake and Mitigated Negative Declaration after packet posted.

Brief discussion was held on test pits, possible quarry locations and work in the Funks Reservoir.

Director Arnold suggested a single printout of public records requests to pass around at the Sites Joint Reservoir Committee & Authority Board Meetings.

Conduct an annual review of all the Authority Board adopted policies and provide direction to Staff related to future consideration of changes. **Motion carried**: All **Directors present voted yes**.

3. DISCUSSION AND INFORMATION ITEMS:

3.1 Review and comment on the Project's approach for complying with the State's Lake and Streambed Alteration (LSA) requirements in the form of a near-term Master Agreement followed up with site-specific agreements through construction.

Ms. Forsythe presented on the Master LSA Alteration Agreement and spoke to the following:

- Fish and Game Code section 1602 requires notification to the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) prior to beginning any activity that may divert or obstruct the natural flow of, change the bed, channel, or bank, deposit or dispose of material, into any river, stream or lake, including when dry.
- LSA Notification Application needs to be submitted to CDFW to determine if an agreement is needed based on project activity and resources affected.
- Master LSA Agreement approach, estimated impacts, fees and mitigation.

Kunde inquired as to Funks Reservoir qualifying in the jurisdiction of the LSA application.

Ms. Forsythe clarified that the Authority falls under the jurisdiction of CDFW, and the Authority is undertaking the activities. The entirety of Funks Reservoir is not impacted, only modifications within the reservoir are included in the calculation of the estimated impacts for the LSA application.

Director Sutton spoke to the coordination and consultation with Tehama-Colusa Canal Authority (TCCA) before application submittal.

RC Chairman Bettner spoke to strategizing with Glenn Colusa Irrigation District (GCID) for efficiency with CDFW, before application submittal.

Ms. Forsythe agreed to coordinate with Director Sutton and RC Chairman Bettner regarding TCCA and GCID strategies.

Executive Director Brown noted the level of detail going into the Master Agreement Application will be taken from what is already reflected in the Environmental Impact Report and there will be further opportunities for site-specific agreements throughout construction.

3.2 Receive an update on the Joint Ad Hoc Governance Committee and comment on the focus areas that the Committee has determined need to be addressed in 2023.
