MINUTES

CALL TO ORDER/PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:

Authority Board Chairman Durst called the Joint Authority Board (AB) and Reservoir Committee (RC) Meeting to order at the hour of 9:00 a.m., followed by Roll Call and the Pledge of Allegiance.

ROLL CALL/ATTENDANCE:

Roll of the Authority Board equaled 9 members in attendance, which resulted in a quorum.

Roll call of the Reservoir Committee equaled 17 representatives, 78.76% in attendance, which resulted in a quorum.

INTRODUCTIONS:

The Sites Staff, Consultants, and members of the public introduced themselves.

AGENDA APPROVAL:

Chairman Durst entertained the motion for everyone to approve the January 20, 2023 Joint Reservoir Committee and Authority Board Meeting Agenda. **Motion carried unanimously.**

ANNOUNCEMENT OF CLOSED SESSION:

Counsel Doud announced the Authority Board of Directors, and the Reservoir Committee Members would consider Closed Session matters 5.1 & 5.2.

PERIOD FOR PUBLIC COMMENT:

Authority Board Chairman Durst called for a period of public comment. Hearing none, he closed the period for public comment.

CONSENT AGENDA:

Reservoir Committee Chairman Bettner and Authority Board Chairman Durst made time to consider consent agenda items 1.1 through 1.4 as follows:

- 1.1 Reservoir Committee and Authority Board consider approval of December 16, 2022, Joint Reservoir Committee and Authority Board Meeting Minutes.
- 1.2 Reservoir Committee and Authority Board consider acceptance of the Sites Project Authority Treasurer's Report.
- 1.3 Reservoir Committee and Authority Board consider approval of the Payment of Claims.
- 1.4 Reservoir Committee considers approval of authorizing the Authority to enter into a Financial Assistance Agreement with the United States Bureau of Reclamation securing the FY22 \$80 million WIIN Act storage funds allocated to the Sites Project.

ACTION RESERVOIR COMMITTEE:

It was moved by Azevedo seconded by Traynham to approve Consent Agenda Item Numbers 1.1 through 1.4. **Motion carried unanimously.**

ACTION AUTHORITY BOARD:

It was moved by Director Dennis seconded by Director Evans to approve Consent Agenda Item Numbers 1.1 through 1.3. Motion carried: All Directors present voted yes.

Executive Director Brown spoke to the approval process for the Sites Joint RC & AB meeting consent agenda items, noting per the Bylaws, the Authority Board and Reservoir Committee will continue to have separation of approval, dependent upon the agenda item.

2. ACTION ITEMS:

None.

3. <u>DISCUSSION AND INFORMATION ITEMS</u>:

3.1 Review and discuss steps of converting to Storage Allocation based participation.

Angela Bezzone presented on Converting to Storage Allocation-Based Participation and spoke to the following:

• Storage allocation methodology, approved on April 16, 2021, established equitable treatment between local partners, without disproportionate benefits to the State and Reclamation.

- Storage partners will make management decisions based on their storage allocation; Authority's contractual obligation will be to provide storage allocation as dedicated space and a proportionate share of diverted water.
- Storage partners should evaluate their Supply vs. Storage leading up to soft call mid-2023.
- Calculations considering the change in deadpool and recent survey refinements to reservoir capacity will be finalized, and we will seek approval to make transition to Storage Allocation based participation in April or May.

Cheng received clarification that all combined local partners include all the Reservoir Committee partners, and he spoke to future preparation for discussions with agency home boards regarding the changes between Supply and Storage.

Eckhart spoke to the possible reduction in cost to participating agencies depending on the Bureau of Reclamation's participation.

Kunde spoke to the potential risk of disproportion with storage-based participation, particularly at times when storage in the reservoir is low; and Ms. Forsythe noted the possibility of approaching a plan for potential risk as the reservoir nears deadpool through the next version of the reservoir operations plan.

3.2 Review and confirm key points of response to Reclamations' December 16, 2022 letter indicating interest in participation in the Sites Project at ~16%.

Executive Director Brown spoke to key points listed in the staff report that the Authority intends to communicate in response to Reclamation's participation letter.

Kunde raised a concern about indicating "commit" to making the adjustments to accommodate Reclamation at 16%. Executive Director Brown clarified that it should be understood that "commit" is to pursue the direction over the course of the next two years while considering all of the other variables to participation.

Brief discussion followed.

3.3 Receive an update on the United States Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Rural Development (RD) Loan.

Mr. Robinette presented on the USDA Loan Update and spoke to the following:

 Maxwell Intertie Project is a subset of facilities on the Sites Reservoir Project. Benefits of the community connecting the Tehama Colusa Canal to Glenn-Colusa Irrigation District Main canal includes improved drought resiliency and economic resiliency for the rural communities.

- Changes include value planning, pipeline alignments, and construction cost has increased from \$375M to \$500M primarily due to time and escalation.
- Benefits include an Interest rate cap of 3.875 % (hedge), reduced debt service by 1-2% in the current market, demonstrating diverse political support, and more financing secured.
- Risks include unfavorable credit structure, "Independent Utility", forced refinance, and additional compliance.

Cheng spoke to the repayment terms for the USDA loan and Mr. Gardels confirmed that the repayment terms are 40 years from the loan closing date.

4. REPORTS:

4.1 Chairpersons' Reports:

RC Chairman Bettner noted how useful the schedule in the agenda packet is and encouraged local agencies to use it when presenting to their boards.

AB Chairmen Durst spoke to an upcoming tour of Sites with Chief Sisk of the Winnemem Wintu Tribe and he encouraged others to consider tours noting that virtual tours were an alternative option.

4.1 Committee & Workgroup Chairpersons' Reports:

Operations & Engineering

Kunde reported the discussion at the O&E meeting included the project baseline schedule, material changes, key pieces to keep the project on track, and discussion on storage-based allocation.

Legislative and Outreach

Director Sutton spoke to the future Legislative & Outreach meeting on February $\mathbf{1}^{\mathsf{st}}$ and encouraged interested Reservoir Committee members to attend. He noted there may be a trip to Sacramento in the spring to meet with the new members of Congress.

Mr. Spesert spoke to the second community working group meeting held in the Maxwell office on January 19th.

Director Evans spoke to the lack of local business participation at the Sites Community Working group and suggested outreach to local businesses in Williams, Colusa, and Willows, in addition to Maxwell.

Director Sutton asked for suggestions on local business participation.

Director Arnold noted he is on the Glenn County Business Committee and will forward the local business contacts.
