Final EIR/EIS Status

- Final EIR/EIS is in review with Reclamation's DC Office
- Once Reclamation is authorized to release the document, Authority will post on our website at <u>www.sitesproject.org/environmental-review/</u>
- Final EIR/EIS will be posted at least 10 days prior to Board hearing

Board Hearing Process – EIR Action Item

- 1. Staff Presentation
- 2. Public Hearing
- 3. Reservoir Committee and Authority Board Discussion and Deliberation
- 4. Reservoir Committee Recommends Action
- 5. Authority Board Takes Action

Staff Presentation – Time to Orient Everyone

- Staff presentation
 - Overview of the Project
 - Review of any additional comments received since the Final EIR/EIS was published
 - Review of prior briefings
 - Review of CEQA process and what it means for the Board to certify the EIR and approve the Project

Public Hearing – Board to Hear Directly from Members of the Public

- Public hearing
 - Open for public comments
 - Organized and orderly process to walk through comments
 - In-person, then virtual
 - Time for the Board to hear from the public
 - Not a comment/response format
 - Close hearing after all comments received

Reservoir Committee and Authority Board Discussion and Deliberation

- Reservoir Committee and Authority Board discussion and deliberation
 - Opportunity to ask staff questions and seek clarifications
 - Opportunity to deliberate on Project merits and challenges
 - Opportunity to share thoughts and reasoning

Reservoir Committee Recommends Action

- Reservoir Committee recommends action
 - Advising the Authority Board
 - Recommending a course of action
 - Reservoir Committee, in and of itself, is not taking an action
- Individual Reservoir Committee members
 - Making recommendation in their role as a Sites Project Authority Reservoir Committee member
 - Action not binding on individual member's respective agency

Authority Board Takes Action

- Authority Board take an action, using its independent judgement
 - Voting to take action that is binding on the Sites Project Authority
 - If Project is approved, then the Sites Project Authority can be sued
 - Filing and posting of the Notice of Determination starts a 30-day statute of limitations on court challenges
- Individual Authority Board members
 - Voting in their role as an Authority Board member
 - Action not binding on individual member's respective agency

What is the Action?

- Structured as one resolution
 - Certifies Final EIR
 - Adopts CEQA Findings, Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program, and Statement of Overriding Considerations
 - Considers Project Approval
 - Decide whether or how to approve or carry out the project
 - If Project approved, authorizes Executive Director to file Notice of Determination, pay all associated fees, and certify Record of Proceedings within 5 days of Project approval
