#### Background

- USFWS implements the Eagle Act program and issues permits for short- and long-term disturbance
  - No net loss standard
- Authority currently holds an Eagle Act permit for geotechnical activities through 2026
- Staff proposing to submit Eagle Conservation Plan which would cover Project construction and operations

# **Construction and Operations Effects to Eagles**

- Golden eagles
  - Construction
    - Disturbance of three nests
      - "Disturbance" is defined as activities within 1 mile of active nest
  - Operations (including recreation)
    - Disturbance of up to two nests
    - Loss of three territories that overlap with the reservoir footprint
- Bald eagles
  - Construction
    - Removal of one nest in the Golden Gate Dam footprint
      - Removal during the non-nesting season considered "take" under Eagle Act
  - Operations (including recreation)
    - Disturbance of one nest
      - "Disturbance" is defined as activities within 660 feet of active nest
    - Increase in foraging habitat (benefit)

## **Take Minimization Measures**

- Measures to reduce amount of take include measures from the Final EIR/EIS:
  - Continued surveys
  - Avoid, minimize and compensate for nests and habitat lost that are important to eagles
  - Construction and maintenance best management practices
    - Removal of vegetation important to eagles during the non-breeding season
    - Minimize use of rodenticides
    - Construction of overhead power lines following practices to reduce bird collisions
- Additional measures specific to Plan:
  - Conduct activities in the non-breeding season to the extent possible
  - Implement nest buffers for active nests to the extent possible
- Implement adaptive management

### **Mitigation Requirements**

- Nest disturbance
  - USFWS in-lieu fee program for power-pole retrofit
    - Uses standard USFWS Resource Equivalency Analysis methodology for mitigation (used nation-wide)
    - Mitigation can roll forward if not used
- Habitat loss for golden eagle
  - Acquisition and permanent protection/management of breeding and foraging habitat
  - Also required in Final EIR/EIS mitigation measures and would be stacked with other habitat/species measures
- Costs are within the overall mitigation cost estimate

#### **Requested Action**

 Authorize the Executive Director to submit the Project's Eagle Conservation Plan for an Eagle Act Permit for Project construction, operations and maintenance activities.
