MINUTES

CALL TO ORDER/PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:

Chair Durst called the Authority Board (AB) and Reservoir Committee (RC) Meeting to order at 9:00 a.m., followed by Roll Call and the Pledge of Allegiance.

ROLL CALL/ATTENDANCE:

Authority Board: 7 members were present, constituting a quorum.

Reservoir Committee: 20 representatives (95.01%) were present, constituting a quorum.

INTRODUCTIONS:

The Sites staff, consultants and members of the public introduced themselves.

AGENDA APPROVAL:

ACTION RC: Moved by Ms. Traynham, seconded by Mr. Cheng, to approve the December 19, 2025, meeting agenda. **Motion carried unanimously.**

ACTION AB: Moved by Director Vanderwaal, seconded by Director Evans, to approve the December 19, 2025, meeting agenda. **Motion Carried: All Directors present voted yes.**

ANNOUNCEMENT OF CLOSED SESSION:

General Counsel (GC) Doud announced that the Authority Board of Directors and the Reservoir Committee Members would consider Closed Session matters 5.1. through 5.7.

PERIOD FOR PUBLIC COMMENT:

Chair Durst called for a period of public comment. The Board heard comments from union representatives who raised concerns related to the contractor selection

process, emphasizing the importance of local hiring, and the use of union labor. Union representatives expressed reservations about whether the proposed contractor would adequately meet these objectives and reiterated the need for clear commitments to a Project Labor Agreement (PLA) and workforce protections.

A representative of the building trades noted that discussions with Barnard Construction were ongoing and stated that the parties were in communication regarding labor issues and the potential negotiation of a PLA. Speakers affiliated with Barnard Construction expressed a commitment to working with local unions, engaging the regional workforce, and negotiating in good faith consistent with the Authority's labor policies.

A written comment was submitted by Jack Cunningham on behalf of the Colusa County Chamber of Commerce and CalChamber regarding the contractor selection process. The comment emphasized the Chamber's position that, when multiple firms are deemed qualified, priority should be given to in-state and local firms in recognition that project funds ultimately derive from taxpayers. He highlighted the economic benefits of keeping expenditures within California and urged the Authority to consider these factors and prioritize in-state and local firms when making final decisions.

Hearing no further public comment, Chair Durst closed the period for public comment.

1. **CONSENT AGENDA:**

Chair Durst noted a requested clarification to the November 21, 2025, meeting minutes related to Item 2.2, stating that the minutes should reflect that Ms. Traynham and Mr. Parker abstained from the vote and did not participate in the discussion due to conflicts of interest. He emphasized the importance of accurately documenting abstentions and reminded members that when a conflict exists, participation in discussion should be avoided and, when appropriate, members should consider leaving the room.

ACTION RC: Moved by Ms. Pryor, seconded by Vice Chair Navarrot, to approve all items on consent agenda. **Motion carried unanimously.**

ACTION AB: Moved by Director Kaplan seconded by Director Vanderwaal, to approve the consent agenda. **Motion carried unanimously.**

2. **ACTION ITEMS:**

2.1 Reservoir Committee and Authority Board consider approval of storage capacity reassignments as follows: Wheeler Ridge-Maricopa Water Storage Replenishment District voluntarily reassigning 6,234 acre feet of storage allocation to Santa Clara Valley Water District.

Executive Director (ED) Brown presented the proposed reassignment of storage capacity between Wheeler Ridge-Maricopa Water Storage District and Santa Clara Valley Water District, noting that the request was consistent with the Project Agreement, which requires participant consent for capacity reassignments. Prior to discussion, Reservoir Committee Vice Chair Rob Kunde disclosed that while he had no direct financial interest in the transaction, the proposal involved a monetary agreement between the two participating agencies. Vice Chair Kunde also noted that he would abstain from the vote out of an abundance of caution. GC Doud addressed questions regarding potential conflicts of interest and confirmed that Vice Chair Kunde's participation in the discussion was permissible.

ED Brown explained that the reassignment reflected the natural evolution of participant interests as the project advances and emphasized the importance of aligning participation levels in advance of upcoming Benefits and Obligations contract execution. He outlined the procedural requirements for approval, including the need to meet a 75 percent voting threshold and to obtain written consent from all projected participants following the vote. Board members asked clarifying questions regarding the timing of the participant authorizations, the February 1st submittal request for consent forms, and whether individual agency boards would need to take separate action. ED Brown clarified that authorization requirements would depend on each agency's internal governance and prior delegations of authority.

Chair Durst mentioned that capacity reassignment is an anticipated and ongoing process under the project agreements and advised participants that, if they are considering a reassignment, they should begin the process early rather than waiting until later stages of project development.

Vice Chair Sutton commented that capacity reassignments had always been envisioned as part of the project, reflecting participants adjusting their interests over time, and should be viewed as a normal aspect of a living project rather than a sign of withdrawal.

ACTION RC: It was moved by Ms. Pryor, seconded by Mr. Cheng to recommend approval of agenda item 2.1 to the Authority Board. **Motion carried unanimously with abstentions from Katherine Maher and Robert Kunde.**

ACTION AB: It was moved by Director Sutton, seconded by Director Vanderwaal, to approve agenda item 2.1. **Motion carried unanimously.**

- 2.2 Reservoir Committee and Authority Board consider approval of a consulting agreement/contract with Acqua Consulting to provide Deputy Engineering and Construction Manager services in the amount not to exceed \$33,600/month for the period of January 19, 2026, through December 31, 2026.

ED Jerry presented a proposed contract with Acqua Consulting to provide additional project management and implementation support as the Sites Project transitions from planning toward construction. Brown explained that the consultant, Rob Natoli, would strengthen the Authority’s capacity in engineering and construction management, particularly in preparation for upcoming CMAR activities related to conveyance facilities. He noted that the position had been anticipated in the previously approved budget and was part of the planned staffing ramp-up needed to support land acquisition, environmental permitting, and construction readiness. Board members asked clarifying questions regarding the contract term, budget consistency, and termination provisions. ED Brown confirmed that the agreement includes a standard 60-day termination clause and reiterated that the contract costs were accounted for in the approved budget.

Chair Durst reminded the Board that the next anticipated hire would be the Deputy Environmental Planning and Permitting position, and ED Brown noted that additional real estate positions would follow closely thereafter to support upcoming land acquisition efforts.

ACTION RC: It was moved by Ms. Pryor, seconded by Mr. Weghorst to recommend approval of agenda item 2.2 to the Authority Board. **Motion carried unanimously.**

ACTION AB: It was moved by Director Kaplan, seconded by Director Vanderwaal, to approve agenda item 2.2. **Motion carried unanimously.**

3. **DISCUSSION AND INFORMATION ITEMS:**

- 3.1 Receive updated drafts of the Benefits & Obligations (B&O) Contract, updated Bylaws, amended and restated Joint Powers Agreement (JPA), and Operations Plan V2.2 and perform a final document review of each in advance of the upcoming start of investor commitment, which will be when the final signature versions (i.e, no further changes accepted) of the documents are circulated.

Mr. JP Robinette provided an update on the Draft Benefits & Obligations (B&O) Contract, updated Bylaws, amended and restated Joint Powers Agreement (JPA) and the Operations Plan V2.2. Mr. Robinette explained that the documents are approaching a “pre-execution” stage and are intended to support upcoming participant decision-making during the investor commitment escrow period. Mr. Robinette summarized key revisions since the prior review, including resolution of several previously open items related to the default waterfall provisions, clarification

of conditions precedent and off-ramps, and incorporation of participant comments on operational assumptions. He noted that additional work remains underway on project governance matters and downstream capacity provisions, which are being addressed through ad hoc committees.

Vice Chair Sutton commented on the importance of ensuring consistency between the B&O Contract and facilities use agreements, noting that alignment among governing documents would be critical as participants prepare for board-level approvals. Mr. Robinette acknowledged the comment and confirmed that conforming language would be incorporated as part of the ongoing document refinement.

Director Evans commented that Colusa County does not support creating new fisheries in creeks where fish historically did not exist. He referenced existing memoranda of understanding related to Stone Corral Creek and emphasized that any releases or operations should remain consistent with water right negotiations and existing agreements. Evans noted that the current framework provides sufficient flexibility to manage inflows and outflows without establishing fish conditions beyond historical use.

Additional clarifying questions were asked regarding the remaining open issues, the anticipated schedule for final comments, and how future revisions would be communicated to participants. Mr. Robinette confirmed that written comments are due by February 2, after which a final draft will be prepared to support a future resolution to offer capacity.

- 3.2 Discuss the assumption that the Project's operational electric power needs will be met through the purchase of wholesale power, as supported by recent analysis.

ED Brown reported on the intent to pursue a wholesale electrical power acquisition strategy for project operations rather than retail power service. It was explained that wholesale power rates are significantly lower than retail rates and that the Authority's application to enter the California ISO interconnection queue enables access to wholesale power markets. He noted that this approach is expected to reduce long-term operating costs and will be incorporated as an assumption in the project's plan of finance.

4. Reports:

4.1 Chairpersons' Reports:

Committee Chair Kunde reported on recent committee and workgroup activity, noting that several ad hoc and standing committees continued meeting to address key project issues. He highlighted ongoing work by the Downstream Capacity Ad Hoc, the Governance Ad Hoc Committee, and an ad hoc group reviewing potential capacity reassignments among participants, including coordination with the Bureau of Reclamation. Chair Kunde also noted that the Operations and Engineering Work Group

held a special meeting and the Coordination Committee continued its regular monthly meetings.

Chair Durst reported that he has been actively working with members on governance-related issues and efforts to resolve outstanding questions. He also noted that he has followed up on comments raised during prior discussions regarding CMAR procurement and the Project Labor Agreement and has been gaining additional insight into how those processes may proceed.

4.2 Committee & Workgroup Chairpersons' Reports:

Committee Chair Kunde reported on a recent special meeting of the Operations and Engineering Work Group, which was convened to review additional CalSim 3 modeling work prepared by staff. He explained that the modeling is intended to provide project participants with a clearer understanding of potential operational scenarios and yield ranges as they evaluate participation decisions. Chair Kunde noted that staff presented two primary operational approaches: one focused on maximizing yield by moving water whenever available, and another that preserves storage capacity for drier years. He stated that the discussion generated significant questions from members, particularly regarding delivery impacts, and that staff is continuing work to refine the analysis, including additional modeling for North-of-Delta participants. Chair Kunde commended staff for their preparation.

4.3 Authority Board & Reservoir Committee Participant Reports:

Vice Chair Sutton noted continued coordination efforts related to governance matters. He also mentioned an upcoming site visit with Congressman Thompson and ongoing outreach activities.

Chair Durst provided an outreach-related update, emphasizing that reassignments are a normal and anticipated part of a large, evolving project such as Sites Reservoir. He cautioned against interpreting reassignments as a withdrawal from the project and encouraged members to communicate this context clearly to their respective boards.

Reservoir Committee Chair Kunde reported that staff had circulated a poll to schedule a four-hour workshop focused on project yield and delivery operations. He explained that several members had expressed interest in a deeper technical review of how reservoir operations would affect yield, timing, and deliveries.

4.4 Executive Director's Reports:

ED Brown reported that the Authority continues to await issuance of a draft water right order. He noted recent outreach efforts, including attendance at a Woodland Rotary meeting, where community members and project investors expressed general support for the project and interest in understanding the project timeline. ED Brown also referenced an upcoming site visit by Congressman Thompson, coordinated by Colusa County, and thanked the County for including the Sites Project Authority as

part of the visit. In addition, ED Brown provided an update on the ongoing fiscal impact analysis for the Maxwell Unified School District, explaining that staff and consultants had recently met to review preliminary results and incorporate additional input, with a final report expected to return to the Board.

Prior to entering closed session, a property owner from the Sites Valley asked why real property negotiations were being discussed in closed session. GC Doud and ED Brown explained that the Brown Act permits closed sessions for real estate negotiations to protect the Authority's negotiating position regarding price and terms, while clarifying that negotiations would occur directly with landowners.
